

## AWARDS

**General Section:** The Hall Committee Rose Bowl will be awarded to the Competitor gaining the highest points, and the Gordon Powell Cup to the Competitor gaining the second highest. The St. James the Less Cup will be won by the resident of Iron Acton Parish who gains the highest points.

**Homecraft Section:** The Acton Aid Cup will be awarded to the Competitor gaining the highest points.

**Sections Having Their Own Trophies:** Classes in these sections will not be given points towards the General and Homecraft Section Trophies.

The Amateur Gardening Red Ribbon will be awarded to the most outstanding exhibit in the Show.

## RULES

1. Entry fees for all Classes:                      20p first entry                      15p all others  
16 Years & Under                                      10p first entry                      5p all others
2. Points are awarded as follows:  
Classes 1 – 5                                      1<sup>st</sup> – 8 Points                      2<sup>nd</sup> – 6 points                      3<sup>rd</sup> – 4 points  
Classes 6 – 89                                      1<sup>st</sup> – 3 points                      2<sup>nd</sup> – 2 points                      3<sup>rd</sup> – 1 point
3. Prize money as follows:-  
Allotment and Classes 1 – 5                      1<sup>st</sup> – £1.50                      2<sup>nd</sup> – £1.00                      3<sup>rd</sup> – 50p  
All Other Classes                                      1<sup>st</sup> – 70p                      2<sup>nd</sup> – 50p                      3<sup>rd</sup> – 30p
4. It is understood that all entries have been made or grown by the Exhibitor and have not been exhibited in any other show.
5. Exhibitors may only enter a maximum of three entries per person, per class.
6. The Judges reserve the right to inspect the garden or allotment of any Exhibitor.
7. Any complaints must be made to a member of the Committee by 2.45pm on the day of the show.
8. Doors will be open at 9.00am on Saturday 10<sup>th</sup> September 2011 and all entries must be made before 11.00am. Non-perishable entries can also be accepted on Friday 9<sup>th</sup> September 2011 at the Parish Hall between 5.00pm and 6.00pm.
9. Staging must be completed by 11.30am prompt when the Hall will be cleared for judging.
10. In Classes with 3 or less entries the Judges reserve the right to withhold any 1 or 2 prizes.
11. The Judges' decision will be final.
12. Entries from all sections may be donated for sale at the Auction to be held after the Show, and gifts of any kind will be gratefully received.
13. Awards will be presented following the auction. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to ensure that their entry is correctly marked with the appropriate Red or Green sticker. The Horticultural Committee accept no responsibility for exhibits wrongly marked and auctioned accordingly
